LOSS CONTROL

ADOPTED: January 1, 2016

REVISED:

<u>PURPOSE</u>

To establish safe operating procedures for loss control.

PROCEDURE

A. SIZE-UP/ASSESSMENT OF CONDITIONS

- 1. Make sure structure is sound (floors, walls, ceiling, roof).
- 2. Check Utilities status.
- 3. Refer to Operational Guideline "Building Collapse" for further details.
- 4. Evidence/scene preservation

B. SCENE OPERATIONS

- 1. Evidence/scene preservation (refer to Operational Guideline "Fire Cause")
 - I. Preserve evidence of incendiaries. Take photographs.
 - II. Request fire investigator, if required.
 - III. When fire is of suspicious origin restrict access to area of origin to protect investigation.
 - IV. Protect property against unauthorized entry.
 - V. Do not permit owners or occupants to remove valuables during operations without authorization from the Incident Commander.
- 2. Salvage
 - I. Protect salvageable property from damage.
 - II. Consider salvage during operations if possible.
- 3. Overhaul
 - I. Remove all partially burned materials that may rekindle.
 - II. If necessary, use wetting agents outdoors to penetrate fibrous materials, mattresses, etc.
 - III. Check all concealed spaces for hot spots.

IV. Consider use of TIC.

4. Property Release

Turn over property contents to owner/representative at the end of the operation and investigation with approval of Incident Commander and Investigator.

KEY CONSIDERATIONS

- Overhaul will be done with crews in full structural PPE including SCBA.
- Two persons minimum on working teams.
- Rotate initial attack crews for rest, when possible.
